




Fort Donelson Lower Battery on The Tennessee River Trail


The Tennessee River Trail is the state's longest scenic byway, at 440 miles, and meanders along winding 2-lane roads on both banks of the Tennessee River. The route offers roadside serene views of the countryside and connects visitors to the Lower Battery at Fort Donelson, a Civil War site marking a crucial point in the Union's strategic victories along the Tennessee River Trail.







Turkey Creek Overlook at Cherohala Skyway National Scenic Byway

Stretching across portions of North Carolina and Tennessee, the Cherohala Skyway National Scenic Byway crosses through the Cherokee and Nantahala National Forests. Dubbed "the Mile High Legend," portions of the route go above the clouds and reach 5,400-foot elevations. Turkey Creek Overlook offers stunning panoramic views of the Appalachian Mountains and lush forests.












One of its highlights is the renowned Cumberland Gap National Historical Park, where visitors can immerse themselves in the history of a natural passageway that played a pivotal role in American westward expansion.




Sequatchie Valley -
